<p>Create a low relief sculpture using cardboard (no glue or tape required)</p>	<p>Create a 3-D sculpture out of cardboard (you will need tape or glue for this option)</p>

<p>Create an image with a minimum of 5 different layers of cardboard. Work any size you like but keep in mind it is difficult to cut cardboard into small pieces. You can stack pieces of cardboard without permanently attaching them. If you would like your piece to be permanent you will need tape or glue, but this is not required. You can use colored cardboard, marker, or paint but the use of color is completely optional.</p>	<p>Create a 3 dimensional sculpture with cardboard. Use different cardboard attachment techniques (see website for details) along with tape or glue to create a sturdy sculpture. Try using various types of cardboard (visible corrugation, with print, without print, etc. and consider including a little mixed media (optional).</p>
